



Legal Interpreting Committee Mandate

The Legal Interpreting Committee is established by decision of the Executive Committee according to the terms of Article 23.10 of the Statutes.

Functions

The Legal Interpreting Committee engages in dialogue with users of court and legal professional interpretation services such as legislators, courts, judges and bar associations, cooperating with other professional associations and providing interpreters at national and international courts with a platform for networking and learning.

The Committee organises regular training and information seminars.

It shall submit an annual report of activities to the Executive Committee and contribute to the activities report submitted by Executive Committee to each ordinary Assembly.

Composition

The Committee comprises at least three active members, one of whom is the Committee Chairperson, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee. The term of office of Committee members coincides with that of the Executive Committee without prejudice to renewal by the incoming Executive Committee.

The work of the Committee is supported by corresponding members who carry out particular tasks on behalf of the Committee, addressing the specific interests and situations of various regions and other instances.

Budget

The Legal Interpreting Committee shall work within the budget framework approved by each ordinary Assembly and amended annually by the Executive Committee on the basis of the Committee's requests.

Approval and amendment

The Legal Interpreting Committee shall approve and/or amend these terms of reference, subject to final approval by the Executive Committee.
